


WEATHER CAPITAL OF THE WORLD



Nestled in the gently rolling hills of western Pennsylvania, the borough of Punxsutawney is home to approximately 6,000 residents and one famous weather-forecasting groundhog – Punxsutawney Phil.

Originally a Native American campsite halfway between the Allegheny and Susquehanna rivers, Punxsutawney is located on the earliest known trail to the east – the Shamokin path – and was often occupied by members of the Delaware and Seneca tribes. Because the area had an abundance of sand flies – “ponkies” to the Native Americans – it was named “town of the sand flies” or Ponksutenink. When the first settlers arrived, they adapted the name to Punxsutawney.

Jacob Hoover was the first settler in the Punxsutawney area, building the first log cabin and probably the first gristmill in 1814. The Reverend David Barclay came to the area in 1816 and is considered the founder of the town. In 1850, Punxsutawney was officially incorporated as a borough.

Today, visitors to the Punxsutawney area not only enjoy the same wooded hills, sparkling streams, and natural beauty that attracted the first settlers, but also the easy pace and friendliness of a small town, and the unique blend of folklore and fun that is the Weather Capital of the World!

THE LEGEND OF GROUNDHOG DAY

How did a small town give birth to a holiday celebrated around the world and a movie with the same name?

It all started in the 1800s with a group of men looking for something fun to do. They began to gather annually for a groundhog hunt that eventually ended up a quirky celebration based on a centuries-old tradition.

At some point, Clymer Freas, an imaginative newspaper editor in Punxsutawney, tied the groundhog hunt to the European celebration of Candlemas Day. Held on February 2, the midway point between the winter solstice and the spring equinox, Europeans believed that the weather on Candlemas Day could foretell the length of winter. A similar tradition was held in Germany where the forecasting was left to a hedgehog: If the animal came out of its burrow and saw its shadow, he would be frightened and run back underground. If the hedgehog perceived no shadow, it was time to stay above ground, for spring was near.

The folklore was shared in song and verse:

*If Candlemas Day be sunny and bright,
Winter will have another flight.
If Candlemas Day be shower and rain,
Winter is gone and will not come again.*

And so, the Punxsutawney groundhog hunt became Groundhog Day, the annual trek to Gobbler's Knob for Punxsutawney Phil's prognostication of the length of winter. The men who had started out hunting the groundhog became his caretakers and keepers of the legend of Punxsutawney Phil dubbing themselves "The Inner Circle" of the Punxsutawney Groundhog Club.



The first official Groundhog Day trek was held in 1887. Since then, the legend of Groundhog Day has captured the imagination of people across the country and around the world. In the early years, Phil's faithful followers numbered only a few thousand, but as his fame grew, so did the crowds with as many as 30,000 people in attendance at the February 2 event to watch Phil whisper his prediction to the Groundhog Club president in "groundhogese."

What can you expect if you come to Punxsutawney on Groundhog Day? You can expect a one-of-a-kind experience complete with food, fun, music, and a variety of events for any age. The celebration begins on the day before Groundhog Day with annual traditions like the Souvenir Show & Sale (folkart and crafts all with a groundhog theme), Groundhog Day in the Park (ice sculpting, chainsaw carving, and metal arts competition), and the annual showing of **Groundhog Day**, the movie.



At 3 a.m. on February 2, the gates to Gobbler's Knob open as people begin to gather to await the official prediction. While you wait, members of the Inner Circle entertain you with skits, music, entertainers, and a spectacular pre-dawn fireworks show.

Following Phil's prediction, the celebration continues in the downtown area of Punxsutawney. Have breakfast at any number of places, visit Phil's Wedding Chapel to see a Groundhog Day wedding taking place, celebrate your February 2nd birthday at Phil's Birthday Celebration or take a hayride tour of the town.

GOBBLER'S KNOB

The site where Punxsutawney Phil makes his Groundhog Day prediction. While there, walk the quarter-mile wooded trail past metal sculptures and informative displays.

PHIL'S BURROW

When Phil isn't making his prediction (which is 364 days of the year), he is in his natural habitat with a few of his friends. The burrow has an outside window that allows you to see Phil any day of the year during daylight hours.



BARCLAY SQUARE



This beautifully preserved historic town square was named for the founding father of the town, Reverend David Barclay, who donated the land for public use in 1822. The stone Memorial Bandstand in the center of the park was dedicated in 1932 as a memorial to veterans.

As part of the Pennsylvania Wilds region, Punxsutawney abounds with natural attractions, such as hunting, fishing, hiking, biking, and just enjoying the scenery. Be sure to include some of the recreational opportunities listed below in your visit.

MAHONING SHADOW TRAIL

This scenic 15.5 mile trail follows the Mahoning Creek for most of its course throughout the Punxsutawney area. The trail is designed for non-motorized recreational use including bicyclists, walkers, runners, and cross-country skiers.


